# WANTED: Easter Egg Hunt Coordinator

We are looking for an individual (or a few individuals) who can take on the responsibility of managing the Easter Egg Hunt at St. Mark's on Easter morning, Sunday, April 20th. The eggs will be filled and ready to hide on Easter morning.



The responsibilities of managing the Egg Hunt are very simple.

• Get the filled eggs to the Fish Garden (the grass north of the church) after the Easter morning service, and oversee the hiding of the eggs by the teenagers.

(These first 2 steps usually take place between approximately 11:00 and 11:20)

- Start the Egg Hunt at approximately 11:20.
- Oversee the hunt. Make sure everyone is having a good time and finding a few eggs.
- Collect empty plastic eggs to be re-used next year.
- Clean up any debris left in the Fish Garden.



The Passion Play will be performed in place of the Sermon during our Palm Sunday Service on Sunday, April 13th. # **Praying the Stations of the Cross**

Many people find the Stations of the Cross a useful focus for their prayer and devotional practice during the season of Lent. At St. Mark's, we have original artwork from two local artists that hang in the church each Lent.



In the Nave, you can pray with a set of woodblock prints by

Charlie Aldrich. In Stoney Chapel, you can pray with a set of foot-painted tempera paint crosses by Marcel Varoz. You will find booklets to guide your meditation at the back of the church.

# You can also access audio and visual materials (images, audio recordings, videos, and slide shows) to help you pray St. Mark's Stations of the Cross.



## Preparing for Holy Baptism Great Vigil of Easter

In the course of our life-long spiritual journey, there are various doorways of invitation into deeper commitment. Baptism is the doorway into full participation in the universal life and family of the Church. In the Sacrament of Baptism we are incorporated as full members of the Body of Christ. People may be initiated into Christ's Body through the Sacrament of Baptism at any age or stage in life. Baptism may be celebrated at any

time, but is traditionally reserved for one of four baptismal feast days: Easter (March/April), Pentecost (May/June), All Saints (November), and Baptism of our Lord (January).

The Great Vigil of Easter is the primary occasion when, from the earliest days of the Church, new members were welcomed into the fellowship of the Church through Baptism, and it remains the primary occasion for baptism, especially for older children and adults.

In **2025 the Great Vigil of Easter begins on Saturday, April 19 at 8 pm**, and the liturgy is followed by a Feast and Dance Party (in other words, plan to take a long nap that day in preparation for a BIG CELEBRATION!).

During our Ash Wednesday service, we hear these words: "Dear People of God: The first Christians observed with great devotion the days of our Lord's passion and resurrection, and it became the custom of the Church to prepare for them by a season of penitence and fasting. This season of Lent provided. a time in which converts to the faith were prepared for Holy Baptism." (Book of Common Prayer, p. 264-265).

It has become our custom at St. Mark's to formally mark the entrance of those who wish to be baptized at the Great Vigil of Easter into this season of preparation with special prayers during the Sunday liturgies during Lent, beginning the first Sunday of Lent (In 2025 that's Sunday, March 9.)






