# Last Chance for Library Art Exhibit: Deborah Bentley's Origins of Color



# **Bp. Michael Hunn Video Updates**

(1) Mike Wallens - YouTube (April 3, 2024)



In an enlightening conversation, Bishop Michael Hunn and Mike Wallens, the vicar of St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Marfa, Texas, and a notable figure in the Big Bend region, share insights into the multifaceted ministry efforts within the Diocese of the Rio Grande. With responsibilities spanning five congregations, Wallens, alongside Katie Hudak, the curate of the Big Bend, engages in regular worship services across several locations and actively participates in outreach ministries focused on asylum seekers at the border, providing both material aid and pastoral care. The discussion delves into the development of a unique collaborative model among the congregations that

emphasizes mutual support without merging identities, driven by a shared mission to expand outreach efforts and foster community growth. Wallens highlights the significant role of youth ministry, supported by grants and partnerships, in bridging communities across the US-Mexico border, thereby nurturing a vibrant network of support among teenagers. Additionally, the narrative touches on the ethical and humanitarian challenges faced by Border Patrol agents, offering a nuanced view of border security dynamics. The conversation also introduces innovative initiatives aimed at rectifying environmental and social injustices within the region, demonstrating the diocese's commitment to holistic ministry and social justice.

#### (1) Long Walk Pilgrimage - YouTube (April 6, 2024)

The Long Walk to Bosque Redondo: A Dark Chapter in U.S. History Between 1863-1866, an estimated 10,000 Native Americans were forcibly removed to Bosque Redondo, with about 3,000 deaths occurring during or after the journey, known as the Long Walk. This video covers a pilgrimage to Bosque Redondo (Fort Sumner, New Mexico) by the Diocese of the Rio Grande General Convention deputation, focusing on anti-racism training and learning about the historic racism against Native Americans. The video highlights personal reflections, the importance of remembering this history, and the continued impacts of such events. It features interviews with clergy members and diocese representatives, who discuss their reasons for joining the pilgrimage, the importance of acknowledging past atrocities, and the role of storytelling and memory in healing and reconciliation. The script underscores the significance of learning from and never repeating such histories, emphasizing the sacredness of the land and the resilience of its people.
