#### St. Mark's Coffee Hour

Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it. (Hebrews 13:2)

Hospitality is a core Christian spiritual practice. At St. Mark's we strive to practice hospitality in everything we do—from big things—like remodeling our building to making our worship space and restrooms more accessible; to small things—like wearing nametags which help everyone remember and respectfully use people's names and correct pronouns.

On Sunday Mornings our hospitality begins when our coffee team arrives early to start brewing coffee and our altar guild arrives early to prepare the altar for worship. Hospitality continues as our greeters welcome folks at the door with a smile and our ushers provide orders of worship. Hospitality reaches it's high point in our celebration of Holy Communion—where God welcomes ALL who hunger to share in the Heavenly Feast. The feast continues after each service, flowing into a lively time of food and fellowship at Coffee Hour.

St. Mark's Coffee Hour is somewhat legendary—it offers visitors a first taste (both literally and figuratively) of the warmth, openness, and connection that makes the St. Mark's community special. We are able to extend such generous hospitality and enjoy such robust fellowship week after week because EVERYONE contributes SOMETHING to make it happen!

We want to say a Huge THANK YOU to everyone who contributes to hospitality, and especially coffee hour, at St. Mark's, and if you're not already active in supporting coffee hour at St. Mark's, we want to INVITE YOU TO JOIN US in this important work!

As we move through seasons in the natural world, so too we move through seasons of grief. In each season prayer, remembrance, and community are essential sources of support for our journey. Mother's Day can be especially poignant as we remember the mothers we've longed for and the mothers we've lost as well as the children we've longed for and the children we've lost.

#### Feasibility Survey Results Are In!

**83%** of parishioner households invited to participate in the St. Mark's building renewal Feasibility Survey chose to respond an *exceptional* response rate, by any measure!

**94%** of responding households were in favor of moving ahead with a Capital Campaign to support the building renewal.

The survey, conducted by Vandersall Collective in March, "tested" the responses against a fundraising goal of \$5.2 million, a number based on the estimated construction costs of St. Mark's building renewal projects under consideration. (These projects are outlined in detail in the Case Statement provided with the survey forms. Please ask the

church office if you need a copy.)

Based on its review of both the quantitative data and narrative responses, Vandersall Collective's final Feasibility Study Report recommended setting the Capital Campaign goal at a smaller number - \$2.8 million. In the coming weeks, St. Mark's Building Renewal Committee and Vestry will meet with our architects and engineers to consider revisions to the projects based on the revised fundraising goal.

The 42-page Feasibility Study Report and a Presentation summarizing the Report are attached here. The 68-page appendix to the report, which includes respondent data and comments, is available in the church office for anyone to review. Additionally, an Adult Education Forum on the Feasibility Study results will be Sunday May 18th.

#### Eldering Saturday, May 10, 9:30 AM







Cristina Rathbone The Asylum Seekers: A Chronicle of Life, Death, and Community at the Border



#### #4: Save the Dates: Prayer Vigils & Migration with Dignity Pilgrimage:


