St. Mark's Participated in the Good Friday Offering

From Presiding Bishop Michael Curry:

Last May, I had the privilege of meeting the Rev. Canon Faiz Basheer Jerjes and his colleague, Sinan Hanna, of St. George's Anglican Episcopal Church in Baghdad—the only Anglican church in Iraq. After a moving conversation, Fr. Faiz asked one thing of our church: "Please don't forget us."



I assured him that we would not forget— and I need your help to honor that pledge, not only to him, but to the whole Anglican Province of Jerusalem and the Middle East, which we have supported through the Good Friday Offering for over a century, through conflict, pandemic, and humanitarian disasters. The Episcopal Church will not forget them. We will not forget our siblings in Christ who cannot worship God freely. We will not forget those caught in the crossfire between warring factions in the land where our Lord walked. We will not forget that every human child of God— Palestinian, Israeli, Iraqi, Cypriot, Lebanese, everyone—

deserves safety and security. As we mark our Lord's passion and death on Good Friday, we remember those whom he loves facing injustice and oppression today, and remember the urgency of love—true, sacrificial love. Read the entire letter here.

By supporting life-giving ministries in the Anglican Province of Jerusalem and the Middle East, including St. George's, Baghdad; the eye clinic in Ras Morbat, Yemen; the Al Ahli Arab Hospital in Gaza; and numerous other institutions identified by their dioceses, you are ensuring that our siblings in Christ are not forgotten.

- Al Ahli Arab Hospital in Gaza City provides critical medical care to all people, in peacetime and wartime alike.
- St. George's is the only Anglican church in Iraq, serving local Indigenous communities and displaced people through worship, schools, and medical care.
- Christ Church in Aden, Yemen, serves as the grounds of Ras Morbat Eye Clinic, providing critical medical care for all in a war-torn country.
- The Christian National Kindergarten at St. Philip's Episcopal Church, Nablus, in the West Bank, provides high-quality early education to all kindergartners, regardless of religion.

Once again, St. Mark's is partnering with <u>East Central Ministries</u> (ECM) to sell vegetable, herb and flowering plants for your spring garden.

- · lots of heirloom and hybrid tomatoes, all colors and sizes
- · peppers- heritage chile, hot, and bell...
- · strawberry plants and a mix of herbs
- · wave petunia hanging baskets

Between 1 and 5 p.m. Thursday, May 9 and Friday, May 10, we will be selling petunia pots, herbs, tomatoes and peppers in the narthex. We'll take a break on Saturday and then come back Sunday morning, May 12, Mother's Day. Come by before or after worship on Sunday.

The proceeds this year will be shared between ECM, whose greenhouse staff grows these healthy plants from seed, right on the Mother Road, and St. Mark's Montessori School, our parish's primary outreach organization.

- ECM works in the International District at Central and Virginia, helping folks with health care, education and housing.
- <u>SMMS</u>: Our non-profit school provides a program of education that meets the needs of young children and their families. We strive to do this by giving children the opportunity to explore and learn through "hands on" experiences and creativity.

Bp. Michael Hunn Video Updates



(4) Katie Hudak on Borderlands Ministry in the Big Bend, Texas - YouTube
In this video Bishop Michael Hunn interviews the Rev Katie Hudak, a curate serving in the Diocese of Rio Grande, specifically focusing on her ministry in Alpine, Texas, and the surrounding Big Bend area. Hudak shares her experiences since being ordained in November 2022, including serving five churches in partnership with Father Mike Wallens. The discussion covers the challenges and successes of adapting church activities during the pandemic, engaging the community through new initiatives like 'Paint a Saint', and the broader efforts to grow and support the congregations financially and spiritually. She also talks about the importance of inclusive ministry in a

diverse community, incorporating both English and Spanish in services, and the unique experiences of ministry in a rural setting. The conversation highlights the collaborative efforts to prevent church closures and the promising growth and revitalization of these communities of faith.

(4) WU 3 Easter 24 LeAnna and El Paso - YouTube

This video provides the weekly update for the Diocese of the Rio Grande during the third week of Easter in 2024, featuring a detailed conversation with Le Anna Brun about the upcoming Camp Stoney events, including family and youth camps with specific details on activities, schedules, and bilingual options. Additionally, it introduces a new segment named Storytime in the DRG, where the history of the Diocese is highlighted with a focus on its early days and the influential figures in El Paso, encouraging a connection and understanding of the Diocese's past and its development. The update emphasizes the importance of community, historical awareness, and Christian formation in supporting the youth and families within the Diocese.
