Dear Members and Friends of St. Mark's:

This past year at St. Mark's we have experienced wonderful growth but important challenges as we work to **Widen the Welcome** of our community.

There have been many blessed events this past year.

One of the most notable was during "Holy Week" liturgies when we had an especially dramatic telling of



the Passion, a poignant and powerful Easter Vigil with several baptisms (including one by full immersion) and a lively and festive dance and meal to celebrate. Our connective "Summer of Conversation" deepened our community sharing experience, strengthening a loving network of relationships. We continue to grow our out-reach through our involvement with Church Unbound: the ministry of sharing food and worship with our unhoused neighbors. Our major outreach ministry, St. Mark's Montessori School, continues to thrive under our new Director Caitlin McGuire. Looking toward a vital future, we have engaged Paul Barribeau of Growth Design Group, a skilled architect, to guide us as we take steps toward renewing our home of worship with an eye toward our Episcopal tradition, beauty, accessibility, and flexibility to support the ongoing vitality of St. Mark's. We want to **Widen the Welcome** of our community to all those the Spirit sends our way for years to come.

As we do every year in the fall, we want to invite you into a time of reflection about how you will support the continuing life and ministry of St. Mark's. This fall we have been offering a series of Vital Conversations around "Caring for Our Gifts." It is intended to widen our understanding of stewardship: The Gift of a Faith Community, The Gift of Time, The Gift of Relationships, and The Gift of the Body, as well as the Gift of Budgets and Giving.
