

Food & Libations for the Agape Feast & Party



Items needed for the evening of Saturday, March 30th

Following the Great Vigil of Easter liturgy (Saturday, March 30th), we will have a celebratory Easter feast and party. There is a sign-up sheet on the table in the narthex. Please sign up and let us know what food or beverages (libations: alcohol or equally appealing non-alcoholic products are welcome) you plan to bring and share at the Agape Feast & Party. Food dishes may be

savory or sweet, breads or salads, entrées or sides, but all food items should be ready-to-eat or in a crockpot that may be plugged in. All are welcome!

A Note About Parking at St. Mark's



Please remember that the City of Albuquerque does ticket during the day as the parking signs warn on the surrounding streets of St. Mark's. We always try to notify the City about weekday events and services but often we are forced to leave a message and send an email and we never hear back. We don't know for sure that the meter officers are being notified of our services. Please follow the following recommendations for parking:

- Please <u>review the map for Church-Owned Parking Lots</u> (our lots are shaded in blue).
- 2. The Northwest lot (Dartmouth/Roma) and the Northeast lot (Richmond/Roma) is always free to members.
- 3. The triangle lot to the south (Richmond/Dartmouth intersection is the farthest corner) is also owned by St. Mark's. We pay Premium Parking to sell daily and monthly slots on this lot, but we are able to use them when we need additional parking.
- 4. Street parking on weekdays MAY RESULT IN A PARKING TICKET if there is a NO PARKING sign. If nothing else is available, you may park in these areas, but, as previously explained, we aren't sure the city is notifying the parking enforcement officers.

If you have received a parking ticket, send a copy of the ticket to Parish Administrator at stmarks@stmarksabq.org. We can waive any ticket from Premium Parking and we will try to have any City ticket waived. However, we recently had two members who received tickets. The City removed the charges for the violation but not the warning so we won't be able to reverse any new tickets that occur within the next six months. The tickets started at \$30 each and escalate quickly by \$30 additional each week when not paid.

Field Trip to See Potential Pipe Organ for St. Mark's



Létourneau Organ at First Christian Church in Colorado Springs, Colorado.
Visit the organ on Thursday, April 4, 2024, at 1:00 p.m.

We got word this week that an organ in Colorado Springs is for sale. The organ was built in 1995 by Létourneau, a *very* fine organ company in Quebec. The organ is quite a bit larger than our Reuter and very beautiful, as you can clearly

see. The congregation that owns it is closing and they want to sell it for around 100k. The company that built it believes they could move it to Albuquerque and install it for around \$200k. To purchase this size and quality of an organ new would probably cost \$1.75 million or \$2 million in 2024.

We have arranged to visit the organ in Colorado Springs on Thursday, April 4th at 1:00 p.m. We will examine the organ inside and out, sing some hymns, play some organ music, and really imagine the organ moving to St Mark's.

Please consider coming. It's possible to fly up and back in one day, or drive up and back in one day, or spend the night.

Even if you are not big into organs, I really think you will find it fun and rewarding.

Holy Week Reflections and a March and Vigil for Humane Treatment in El Paso In this weekly update for the Diocese of the Rio Grande, Bishop Michael Hunn gives a health update and offers an invitation to observe the entire Holy Week starting from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday, highlighting the significance of each day's traditions, services, and rituals. Attention is also drawn to the importance of the Chrism Mass and the sacred oils. The

update calls for participation in a march and vigil for human dignity in El Paso, emphasizing the church's stance on border policy and the human dignity of all people.
