All media accepted.





# **Common Cup Returns for Holy Eucharist**

Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, we made a variety of temporary changes to our normal liturgical practices at St. Mark's, according to the needs of our community and the direction of our Bishop. One of those changes was introducing the option of receiving wine in individual vessels at communion. Despite this temporary concession to a public health crisis, the Common Cup has remained a core symbol of Eucharistic theology and normative Eucharistic practice in the Episcopal Church. In early 2022, at the urging of our bishop, we began a gradual return to normative practice by reintroducing the Common Cup at communion, while continuing to offer the



reintroducing the Common Cup at communion, while continuing to offer the option of individual vessels at the back of the church. **As of September 1, 2024, St. Mark's will discontinue the use of individual vessels for wine at Communion**. If, for any reason, you prefer not to drink from the Common Cup at communion we invite you to participate by reverently acknowledging the presence of Christ in the Common Cup with a reverent nod, bow, touch or kiss--remembering that the Church's historic teaching is that communion in one kind (bread OR wine, alone) constitutes a full communion.
