The Feast of Pentecost June 8th Seeing Red? Wearing Red?


Have you noticed that during the Easter Season we are using red votive candles for the icons?

These are beeswax candles from Ukraine! During the

Easter Season, Christians celebrate by exchanging red colored eggs and by burning red-colored candles for the icons in churches to commemorate Jesus' Resurrection. The red color symbolizes Jesus's blood, but also His, and our, New Life.

You might have also noticed that some Feast Days in the church calendar have particular colors associated with them and people often wear clothing in that color. For example, on Palm/Passion Sunday, the liturgical color is red and people often wear red on that day.

The Feast of Pentecost, coming up on June 8th is a special Feast day celebrating the gift of the Holy Spirit and the beginning of the life of the church. On the Feast of Pentecost everyone is encouraged to wear red as well, to celebrate this lively occasion of the Church's birthday.






How do I/we respond to these times? What do I/we do? What do God and the Church expect of me? What am I to do?





Migration with Dignity Pilgrimage, June 1st through 5th

Join Episcopalians from around the U.S. on the first Migration with Dignity Pilgrimage, June 1-5, in the Dioceses of Rio Grande and West Texas. Coordinated by the Episcopal Migration Caucus, a grassroots group of Episcopalians, this driving pilgrimage will include daily one-hour vigils at immigrant detention centers (with liturgy,

songs, stories), group prayer and reflection, and conversations with local ministries and residents.

Pilgrims will learn directly about the suffering and indignity inherent in our nation's forprofit immigrant detention system, especially the profound harm it inflicts on children and families. The caucus aims to uplift the humanity and dignity of all migrants and hopes to inspire similar acts of solidarity across the church.

The pilgrimage begins on the afternoon of June 1 in Albuquerque and ends mid-day on June 5 in San Antonio, with overnights in El Paso and Marfa, Texas, as well. Transportation and some lodging provided; pilgrims will cover their food, incidentals, and other transportation costs. Local Episcopalians and friends are encouraged to attend one or more vigils close to them.

RIo Grande Borderland Ministry (RGBM) May Community Meeting Update Our Rio Grande Borderland Ministry holds a community **meeting via zoom the 2nd Friday of each month**. At the May Meeting we welcomed the Rev. Leeann Culbreath as our guest speaker. Leeann shared a compelling presentation, with valuable information about the history and conditions in U.S. immigrant detention centers.


The Rev. Leeann Culbreath is a priest in the Diocese of Georgia and an immigrant rights activist. She currently co-chairs the Episcopal Migration Caucus and serves as a co-facilitator of the Episcopal Migration Response Network. In Georgia, she is active with Georgia Detention Watch and the campaign to shut down Folkston ICE Processing Center. Leeann and other members of the Episcopal Migration Caucus will be leading a **pilgrimage/prayer vigil to draw attention to the plight of immigrants in detention June 1-5**, beginning on June 1st in Albuquerque and concluding June 5th in San Antonio.


