

The Three Days that Changed Everything: The Sacred Triduum



Holy Week and Easter are at the center of our lives as Christians and as a worshiping community. The Sacred three days of: **Maundy Thursday**, **Good Friday** and the **Great Vigil of Easter** are a profound way of participating in the mystery of salvation, and the source of meaning for our lives. Through these beautiful and moving liturgies, we not only remember our own deep story founded in God's suffering love, but by participating in it with our whole being through song, quiet meditation, reading, prayer, processions, dancing, and feasting.

Together, we are on a sacred pilgrimage into the dimension of the kingdom of God, encouraging and supporting one another as we journey into the deep mystery of God, bringing new life out of what looks like death, calling us into a new way of being that does not deny our own pain and suffering but opens us to transformation in the power of God's Spirit.

You are encouraged to embrace the beautiful and moving drama of Holy Week by attending the sacred three days of **Maundy Thursday**, **Good Friday** and **The Great Vigil of Easter**. If this is not possible, try attending a part of Holy Week you have never experienced and allow the powerful worship of this week to draw you more deeply into God's love:

Maundy Thursday, March 28

11 a.m. and 7 p.m. - Liturgy & Holy Eucharist with Foot Washing (Hybrid) 9-11 p.m. - Prayerful Watch in Stoney Chapel (In person)

Good Friday, March 29

Noon - Stations of the Cross & Hymns (Hybrid)
7 pm - Traditional Good Friday Liturgy (Hybrid)

Holy Saturday, March 30

9 am - Liturgy & All-Parish Cleaning Day (In person)
8 pm - Great Vigil of Easter (Hybrid)
Paschal Fire, Old Testament readings, a proclamation of the resurrection, and the first Eucharist of Easter.

10 pm - Agape Potluck Feast & Dance (In person)

A Note About Parking at St. Mark's



Please remember that the City of Albuquerque does ticket during the day as the parking signs warn on the surrounding streets of St. Mark's. We always try to notify the City about weekday events and services but often we are forced to leave a message and send an email and we never hear back. We don't know for sure that the meter officers are being notified of our services. Please follow the following recommendations for parking:

- 1. Please <u>review the map for Church-Owned Parking Lots</u> (our lots are shaded in blue).
- 2. The Northwest lot (Dartmouth/Roma) and the Northeast lot (Richmond/Roma) is always free to members.
- 3. The triangle lot to the south (Richmond/Dartmouth intersection is the farthest corner) is also owned by St. Mark's. We pay Premium Parking to sell daily and monthly slots on this lot, but we are able to use them when we need additional parking.
- 4. Street parking on weekdays MAY RESULT IN A PARKING TICKET if there is a NO PARKING sign. If nothing else is available, you may park in these areas, but, as previously explained, we aren't sure the city is notifying the parking enforcement officers.

If you have received a parking ticket, send a copy of the ticket to Parish Administrator at stmarks@stmarksabq.org. We can waive any ticket from Premium Parking and we will try to have any City ticket waived. However, we recently had two members who received tickets. The City removed the charges for the violation but not the warning so we won't be able to reverse any new tickets that occur within the next six months. The tickets started at \$30 each and escalate quickly by \$30 additional each week when not paid.

Holy Week Reflections and a March and Vigil for Humane Treatment in El Paso In this weekly update for the Diocese of the Rio Grande, Bishop Michael Hunn gives a health update and offers an invitation to observe the entire Holy Week starting from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday, highlighting the significance of each day's traditions, services, and rituals. Attention is also drawn to the importance of the Chrism Mass and the sacred oils. The

update calls for participation in a march and vigil for human dignity in El Paso, emphasizing the church's stance on border policy and the human dignity of all people.
