Thursday Maundy Service April 17, at 7:00 PM

Maundy Thursday commemorates the Last Supper, where Jesus washed His disciples' feet and instituted the Eucharist. The services include readings, prayers, foot washing, and Holy Eucharist.






Stations of the Cross & Hymns April 18, at Noon

We begin our descent into the mystery of Good Friday by walking the Way of the Cross with Jesus. We join in procession around the church, singing Good Friday hymns, and pausing to reflect and pray at each of the fourteen Stations of the Cross.

Proper Good Friday Service April 18, at 7:00 PM

Good Friday is the day Christians remember Jesus' crucifixion and death at Calvary. This simple, solemn service includes scripture readings, prayers, and the veneration of the cross.





Faster Vigil Service & Baptisms followed with a Potluck Feast & Dance Party April 19, at 8:00 PM

The first official celebration of Jesus' resurrection. The service begins outside in the Fish Garden to the east of the church with the kindling of the new Paschal Fire and the lighting of the


Paschal candle. join the procession into the church, where the service continues with readings, songs, baptisms, and the first Eucharist of Easter.

Easter Sunday Service

followed with a Resurrection Party & Egg Hunt April 20, at 9:30 AM

Easter Day celebrates the resurrection of Jesus from the dead, which is the cornerstone of Christian faith. Join us for a joyful service including scripture readings, glorious music, and Holy Eucharist, followed by a cupcake reception and Easter Egg hunt.





Holy Saturday Workday All hands on deck! Saturday, April 19th, 9am-11am

Our annual Holy Saturday Workday offers a beautiful opportunity to work together with other members of the St. Mark's community as we prepare our hearts and minds along with St. Mark's building and grounds for our Easter Celebration.

When does the Work Day Begin?

Our Easter Eve Work Day <u>Begins with a short Holy Saturday Liturgy at 9am</u> in the Fish Garden (East side of church). This is a brief 10-15 minute liturgy. Directly after the brief Holy Saturday Liturgy will then reconvene in the Entry of the church for instructions and assignments.


When will we be done?

We hope to be done by 11 am or shortly after that as we want people to have plenty of time before The Great Vigil of Easter at 8pm. Offer what you can at this workday and it will be welcomed. 30 minutes or an hour is helpful.

What work needs to be done?

Our work together will focus on three areas: 1) **The Outdoor Team** will focus on trash pick up, weeding, and light raking around the Church 2) **The Parish Hall Team** will assist Deacon David in decorating the Parish Hall 3) **The Nave Team** will focus on cleaning the nave and chapel, and assist the altar guild in polishing candlesticks and general set up for Easter services (including baptisms and Eucharist.)

Jordan and his friend Nathan passed out the remaining candy from the bunny bags.



Our time together will include spiritual grounding, plenary sessions, community building and workshops. Some of the workshops include:

Current Landscape of Immigration & AMMPARO

- Presenter: Mary Campbell, Director of ELCA AMMPARO
- This workshop will include an overview of basics of immigration in the U.S., updates and issues affecting immigrants under the new administration, the ELCA designation as a sanctuary denomination, the role of sanctuary congregations at this time, and how AMMPARO engages and supports congregations in immigrant accompaniment.

Trauma and Immigration

- Presenters: Dr. Georgina Sanchez-Garcia and Carolyn Swenson
- This workshop will inclue information on immigration-related trauma in children and adults, the meaning and practice of "trauma-informed" accompaniment, recognizing compassion fatigue and vicarious trauma, and the importance of self-care when accompanying immigrants.

Advocacy-Speaking Out for Immigrant Justice

- Presenters: Pastor Brigette Weier and Kurt Rager
- This workshop will cover skills and tools for effective advocacy, organizing in congregations and collaborating with community groups, testifying and speaking out in support of immigrant justice, and including immigrants at all levels of advocacy.

Engaging Congregations in Immigrant Accompaniment

- Presenter: Pastor Hannah DiPasquale
- This large-group session will include resources and ideas for engaging congregations at all levels of current awareness and involvement and connecting with community groups that are immigrant allies.


